CHAPTER 1
General Provisions

Be it ordained by the Selectmen of the Town of
Barnet as follows:

Sec. 1. This and all following ordinances shall be
known as "Ordinances of the Town of Barnet."

Sec. 2. All enactments by the Selectmen for the
government of the Town shall be termed ordinances; proceed-
ings and decisions of a temporary nature shall be termed
resolutions; and the enacting clause, which shall be but
once recited in each, shall be, for ordinances;

"Be it ordained by the Selectmen of the Town of
Barnet as follows."

For Resolutions:

"Be it ordered by the Selectmen of the Town of
Barnet as follows:

Sec. 3. In each chapter every ordinance shall bear
its appropriate section number, being numbered consecutively
in the order of passage.

Sec. 4. No ordinance, resolution, amendment, change
or repeal of an ordinance or resolution shall be acted upon
until it has been reduced to writing. No ordinance, or reso-
lution shall be passed except by a majority vote of the
Board of Selectmen. No ordinance, amendment, change or repeal
of an ordinance shall become effective until notice has been
given by posting and by publication.

Sec. 5. In all alterations or amendments of an
ordinance, the proposed alteration or amendment shall contain
the entire section to be altered or amended, and upon passage
of the altered or amended section, the former section shall
be repealed; provided, however, that such repeal or the
passage of such new ordinances shall not affect any act, right,
penalty, suit, prosecution or tenure of office of any person,
unless expressly stipulated therein; nor shall the alteration
or repeal of any ordinance or section thereof revive any
ordinance theretofore repealed or annulled.

Sec. 6. The Town Clerk shall keep a record of all ordinances, he shall engross these and all other ordinances and resolutions hereafter passed in the order of their passage, keeping separate books for the ordinances and separate books for the resolutions, which shall be marked "Ordinances of the Town of Barnet", and "Resolutions of the Town of Barnet", which books shall be kept at the office of the Town Clerk, subject to the inspection of any person interested therein, and all ordinances enacted shall, after posting and publication, be published in suitable form for the use of all officers of the Town government and for general distribution.

Sec. 7. All licenses and permits provided for in these ordinances shall be issued by the Town Clerk over his signature and only after vote of the Selectmen. All applications for either licenses or permits and any specifications and plans submitted therewith shall be kept on file by the Town Clerk. The Town Clerk shall keep an accurate record of all licenses and permits issued and of all applications therefor which shall be refused. Said record shall contain the date of issue and number of each license or permit, the name of the holder thereof and the substance of the terms and conditions thereof. Such record shall be open to public inspection.

DEFINITIONS

(a) "Public Nuisance".

"Public nuisance" shall mean any activity or condition which is offensive or obnoxious to members of the public or is dangerous or hazardous to public health, safety and welfare.

CHAPTER 2

Sec. 1. The public beach, bathing area and parking lot at Harvey Lake in the Town of Barnet shall be closed to the public between the hours of 10:00 P.M. EDST and 9:00 A.M. EDST, and no person other than maintenance personnel and life guards shall enter upon or make use of the above mentioned beach, bathing area or parking lot during the aforementioned hours when the same are closed to the public.

Sec. 2. A person shall not operate or use any boat, raft or any sort of vessel, except a police or emergency

vessel, within 200 feet of the shores of the public bathing beach at Harvey Lake in said Town of Barnet.

Sec. 3. No person shall litter or dump refuse, garbage or other offensive material upon the public beach, bathing area, or parking lot at Harvey Lake in said Town of Barnet.

Sec. 4. Any person violating Section 1, Section 2 or Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) or imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days.

Sec. 5. No person, firm or corporation, shall conduct or operate a circus, carnival, menagerie, play, concert, festival, entertainment or exhibition of any kind for which money is received from the patrons or those in attendance without a permit issued by the Selectmen of said Town of Barnet.

Sec. 6. A permit shall be issued to allow any of the activities enumerated in Section 5 above only if the Selectmen find that to allow said activity would not constitute a threat to public health, safety and welfare or constitute a public nuisance.

Sec. 7. Any person, firm or corporation, violating Section 5 of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Sec. 8. If any section or provision or part thereof in this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not so adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

The foregoing Ordinances were passed, enacted and adopted by unanimous affirmative vote of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Barnet, Vermont, at a meeting duly called and held at the Town Clerk's Office in the Town of Barnet on the 15th day of June, A.D. 1970, to become effective sixty days from the last mentioned date, and it was ordered by said Board of Selectmen that said Ordinances be published

in the Caledonian Record not more than fourteen days following
the 15th day of June, 1970.
